2. Body Score: (Based on Hennecke Body Score 1-9 with 5 ideal)

Numbers on this scale are based on 5 being the best and 1 being the worst.

3. Ground Work:

- a) 5 Walking while being led.
- b) 4 Trailer Loading.
- c) 4 Round penning.
- d) 4 Yielding hind quarters.
- e) 4 Direct and Driving.
- f) 3 Working with rope around feet, flanks, belly, under tail.
- g) 4 Doing all the above ground work while under saddle.
- h) 4 Doing all the above ground work while saddled and bridled.
- i) 3 Haltering & catching.
- j) 3 Spraying for flies
- k) 5 Stands for farrier
- l) 5 Riding with other horses

4. Working under saddle:

- a) 4 Mounting.
- b) 5 Dismounting.
- c) 4 Suppleness side to side.
- d) 4 Suppleness vertically.
- e) 4 Yielding hind quarters.
- f) 3 One rein stops.
- g) 4 Two handed stops.
- h) 4 Reining using two hands.
- i) 2 Reining using one hand (neck reining).
- j) 4 Walking relaxed and with a loose rein.
- k) 4 Trotting relaxed and with a loose rein.
- l) 4 Loping relaxed and with a loose rein.
- m) 4 Collection under saddle.
- n) 4 Collection while standing still.
- o) 4 Collection while walking.
- p) 4 Collection while trotting.
- q) 4 Collection while loping.
- r) 3 Spookiness while in arena.
- s) 4 Spookiness while outside on trails.
- t) 4 Gait transitions - walk to trot.

- u) 4 Gait transitions - trot to canter.
- v) 4 Gait transitions - Canter to trot
- w) 4 Gait transitions - Trot to Walk
- x) 4 Backing.
- y) 3 Sidepassing.

5. How does horse behave on trails: Solid under saddle, light spookiness to new things but gets over it quickly.
6. How does horse behave with traffic: As long as the vehicles can be heard he's good.
7. Skill level of rider needed for this horse: Experienced rider is ideal to keep moving this horse forward. *in training.

Comments:

Lorales is a very smart horse. He gets ~~over~~ over any spookiness fairly quickly. The first time I rode him he did try to jake me in the saddle but that was the only time he tried anything like that. Can be ridden one handed after a while but two handed riding is best. Really relaxed horse. He does seem to enjoy smaller saddles due to ~~his~~ the shape of his back. I didn't see any soreness from larger saddles though. Responds to leg cues.
