FCER UP CLOSE WITH TERRY COBURN

MARES & FOALS

Happy Valentines Day! FCER with other New Mexico equine recues created legislative change to help horses in peril. 2024 marked a 1-year anniversary win over the kill buyers who bid on rounded-up horses.

The mares and foals are first to be saved; the others in the bands were often lost to a pipeline of terrible abuse on their way to slaughter.

This significant legislation provided a sigh of relief as the new regulation gave the rescues first right of refusal to purchase stray horses.

Rose & Ranger, featured in the FCER fall newsletter were the first to arrive.

Mya & Milo, Emery & Echo and Marshall, were our most recent intakes and featured on page 4.

The branding inspector from the district the horses were gathered posted the notice on the Livestock Board.



When no owner claimed them, they went up for auction.

Because of the new legislation, NM recues such as FCER took precedence. We worked with the Livestock Board to place the horses in the NM rescue closest to where they were captured.

We have yet to fail on a bid to keep them out of the slaughter pipeline, but when they round up 20 or 140 horses at a time, it has been difficult, since most of the rescues are full.

THE BISTI FOAL RESCUE A Love Story—UPDATE

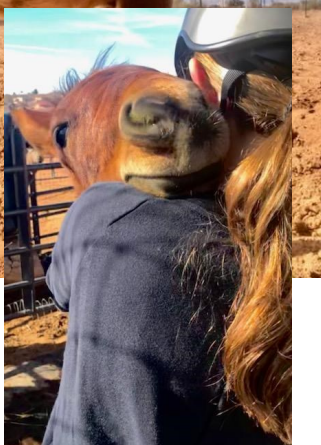
On July 12, 2023 a 3-week-old foal came to FCER after being trampled by a stallion along the Bisti desert highway.

A good Samaritan saved the baby by driving her injured body to FCER. Many thanks to caring people and the rangers who have stepped up and helped these horses.

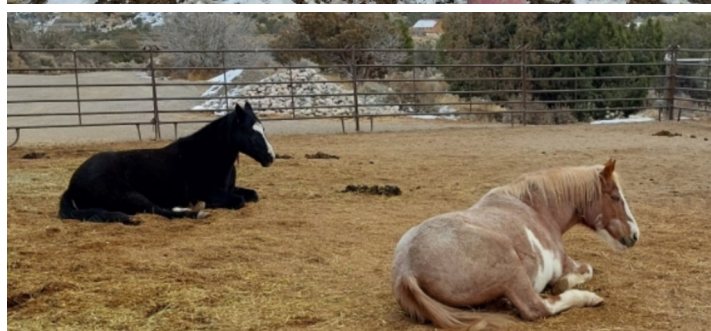

What makes Handsome and Blanca such an adorable equine couple? Love, of course!

Handsome, a regal Arabian is 35-years-old, equivalent to a 98-year-old human. Blanca, a pretty Appaloosa is 27 equivalent to 78 in human years. The two love birds have spent the last 10-years together in their pen swishing the flies in the summer and sharing body heat in the winter. They greet the new rescues as they arrive and watch them being rehabilitated until the rescues leave for their adoptive homes. Handsome and Blanca will spend the rest of their lives at the rescue as Pasture Pals! Handsome has lost his teeth and Blanca is blind!

They are very much a loving couple. When Blanca hears unfamiliar noises, she nervously begins to run in circles. To give her comfort, Handsome will stand closely in front of her so she can feel the protection

of his hindquarter. They knicker playfully at each other and Blanca loves to finish Handsome's Purina Equine Senior meal servings.

Because Handsome has no teeth, he receives a special senior blend of food that is soaked in water to create a mash. Dental care for an equine is as essential to a horse's wellbeing as is companionship. Equines with compromised teeth will pull the grass or hay with its muzzle wadding it into a ball only to cough the undigestible wad out. FCER has rescued many horses that were starving despite having access to a pasture of plentiful grass, because their owner neglected their dental care.

Three 50-pound bags of Purina Equine Senior at \$55.00 each will provide Handsome and the other equine like him about a week of meals.

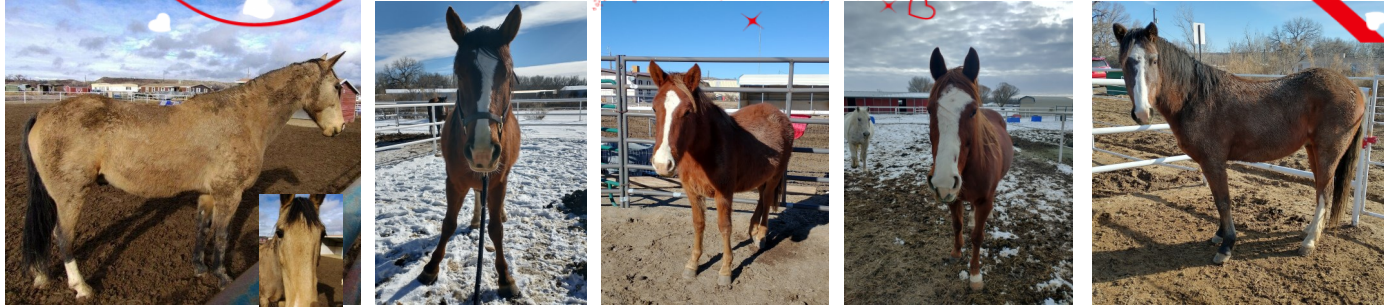
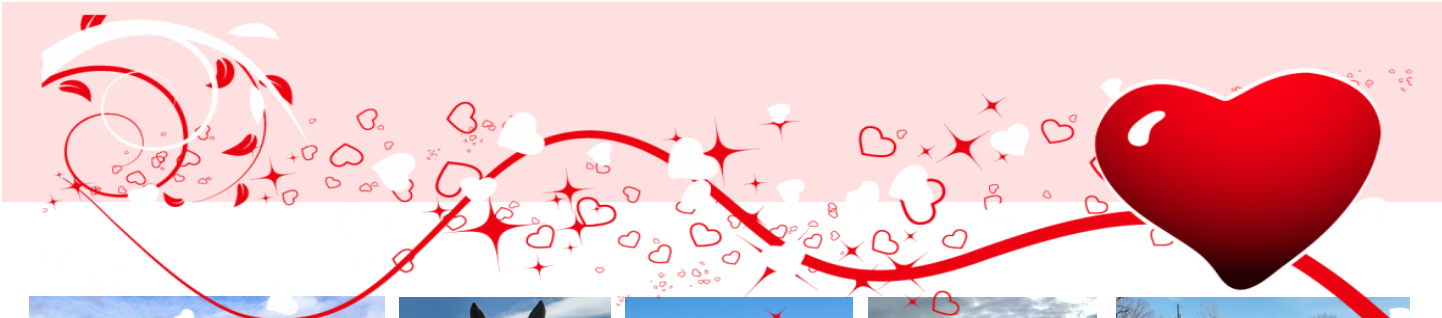

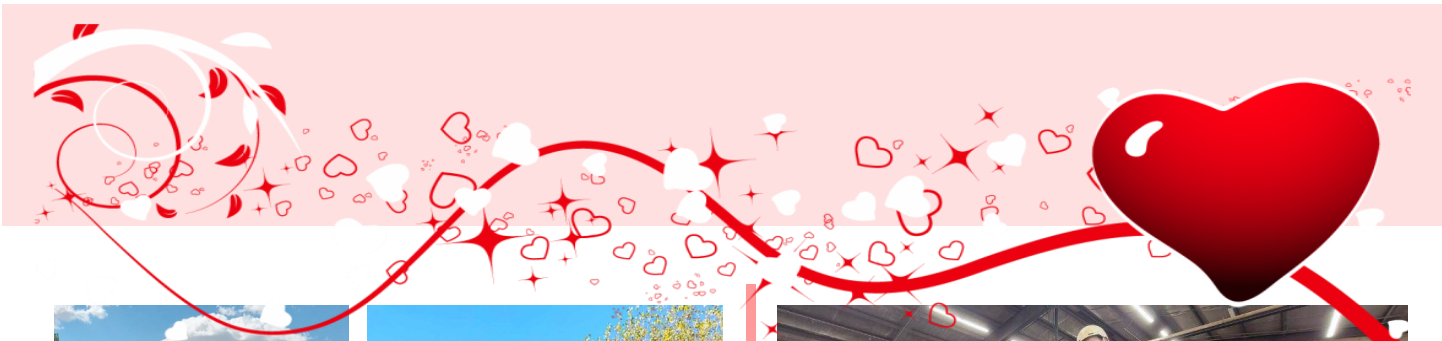
